<b>Summary of Report:</b>	<p>The NHS Long Term Plan (LTP) was published in January 2019 and set out a range of ambitions for the NHS for the next 5 – 10 years. All ‘Local health systems’ were asked to produce local plans for implementing the commitments set out within the LTP. For South Cumbria, this means Lancashire and South Cumbria Integrated Care System.</p> <p>Alongside this, the Bay Health and Care Partners Integrated Care Partnership (ICP) agreed to undertake a refresh of the Better Care Together Strategy (referred to as BCT 2).</p> <p>The BCT Strategy has been developed over a number of months and BHCP Leadership Team and Partnership Board have been engaged in the process through updates and discussion on key elements of the document as they have evolved, such as the key priorities and financial principles.</p> <p>Attached is the final draft that was presented to the BHCP Leadership Team in December. It was agreed at the Leadership Team and the BHCP Partnership Board that this final draft version would be circulated to all partners for consideration prior to agreement of a final version in March. This has been done and meetings to discuss the document have been also been offered (and taken up – eg by Health and Wellbeing Boards and Scrutiny Committees, alongside the ICS Plan). The Health and Wellbeing Board is asked to give consideration and feedback on the document. Following this a final Strategy will be produced for approval by BHCP and partners in March.</p>		

	<p>The Lancashire &amp; South Cumbria Integrated Care System (ICS) was required nationally to submit an ICS Strategic Plan by the 15<sup>th</sup> November, in response to the NHS Long Term Plan (LTP) and the local needs of our population over the next five years. At the October informal HWBB meeting the ICS Plan was still in development and an update on progress was provided. The Plan has now been produced and a copy is attached – again the status of this is draft. Again, HWBB is asked to note development and consider the document.</p>
