	Create links with other boards in Cumbria that have an interest in Prevent, specifically in the first instance the Adults and Children Safeguarding Boards	December 2015
	Initiate links to the Cumbria Alliance of System Leaders (CASL) and Local Alliances of System Leaders (LASL) to understand those environments that children are exposed to that potentially increase their risk of radicalization	June 2016
	Establish a monitoring framework for the delivery of the Prevent programme against success criteria set out by the Government	April 2016 onwards
	Engage with communities locally to engage with local groups and communities who may misunderstand the rationale behind Prevent	As and when concerns are expressed
	Through the Safer Cumbria Partnership to contribute towards the development of a detailed partnership plan that outlines how Prevent can be rolled out to all appropriate organisations in Cumbria	June 2016

	Write into all new contracts an adherence requirement to the principles outlined in the Government Prevent guidance	March 2016
	Whenever new strategies or policies are developed, the policy team will ensure they include reference to Prevent where appropriate	Ongoing
	To provide Members and Officers with the facility to raise their suspicions about the activities of partner organisations.	March 2016
	Communicate with all schools under the control of the Local Authority to make them aware of their responsibilities under Prevent.	December 2015
	Make available to all schools both online and offline, training outlining Prevent referral pathways.	March 2016
