Harraby	<p>Triple F is a not for profit co-operative who directly deliver, or enable communities to deliver community development opportunities to benefit people in Carlisle.</p> <p>Third party funding is required to release a larger £27,000 grant agreed by CWMET to improve Carliol Drive Play Area. The funding will be used to purchase and install new play equipment and assault course equipment. The play area improvements will benefit children aged 8-10 years and their families. The obstacle assault course will benefit anyone aged over 8 years.</p> <p>The improved facility in an area of high childhood obesity will aim to encourage regular exercise, playing outdoors and will provide a positive high quality public space for recreation which is accessible and free to use every day. The new facility will be maintained by Carlisle City Council Green Spaces team.</p> <p>The project aims to contribute to both 0-19 priorities;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>The improved area will enable children and families to regularly exercise and play to keep them active all year round.</i> • <i>The improvements are located in an area with high childhood obesity.</i> • <i>The improvements will provide new fun challenges for children and young people using the play and assault course equipment. It will improve their co-ordination skills and abilities, giving them greater confidence.</i> • <i>It is free and available to use at all times, supporting children and young people to lead a healthy lifestyle.
