APPLICATION REPORT

Application Summary

Led by the North Pennines AONB Partnership, the Fellfoot Forward Landscape Partnership scheme is a major project that will conserve, enhance and celebrate the natural and cultural heritage of a special part of the North West of England. The project has been awarded funding from the National Lottery Heritage Fund and will run from 2020 to 2024.

The National Lottery funding brings just over £2million to support the overall scheme which will invest £3.4million in nature recovery and cultural heritage of the area.

The partnership is seeking funding towards the costs to set up a new young people's project. The partnership wishes to develop and deliver a new programme of landscape and heritage-based engagement for young people.

It will allow young people from across Eden and Carlisle and their youth leaders to work creatively, through workshops and events. To help create a grassroots programme of meaningful, long term and youth-led heritage conservation across the Fellfoot landscape area.

The new programme will offer a legacy of youth-led action for the Fellfoot landscape, which will last beyond the Landscape Partnership Scheme. They will work alongside existing local rural youth groups as well as youth groups in the City/Town and secondary schools.

Funding is sought to run 10 workshops with 100 young people from across Eden and Carlisle area (split equally between the two districts) and their youth leaders. These workshops will include heritage conservation, such as tree planting, local archaeology, wildlife identification and footpath creation. They will also include consultation with participants to help the partnership to consider and construct a mechanism and partnerships for a future programme of lasting heritage engagement for young people in the Fellfoot landscape. The project will last one year, from June 2020 – June 2021.

The Fellfoot area stretches from the Cumbrian fellsides of the North Pennines AONB and UNESCO Global Geopark, to the River Eden and runs north from Melmerby to Hallbankgate.

This project contributes to Cumbria County Council's vision in the 2018 – 2022 Council Plan: to be "A Council that works with residents, businesses, communities and other organisations to deliver the best services possible within the available resources".
