

## Carlisle Local Committee

### Area Planning Workshop – 8 February 2022

#### Background

Carlisle Area Plan 2019-2022 will be updated for 2022-23 to ensure key priorities will act as the focus for Carlisle Local Committee to build on the recovery and resilience from Covid-19 and deliver on several opportunities such as Borderlands Growth Deal, Towns Funding and the ongoing Carlisle Southern Link Road. Carlisle Area Plan 2022-23 gives Carlisle Local Committee the opportunity to set new ambitions to drive improvements and leave a legacy to benefit Carlisle.

#### Carlisle Area Plan Priorities 2022-23

Propose keeping the four agreed priorities as the direction of work with three dedicated working groups and Community Development team working to Local Committee who will oversee performance and drive improvement.

Priority	Working group
1. Developing Our Economy and Infrastructure	Infrastructure Delivery Planning Working Group
2. Improving Health and Wellbeing	Healthy City Forum
3. Improving outcomes for Children and Young People	Children and Young Peoples Working Group
4. Developing Thriving Communities	Community Development team and local stakeholders with the Carlisle Communities Network as overarching group

#### Priority 1 - Developing Our Economy and Infrastructure

Borderlands Inclusive Growth Deal, Towns Funding and Future High Street Fund, St. Cuthbert's Garden Village, Carlisle Southern Link Road. Carlisle highways network, school places, council assets, Carlisle Infrastructure Delivery Plan.  
**NEW:** Carlisle Town Deal Carlisle Southern Gateway and Digital and Community Learning Hub schemes, Environment Fund schemes, Coastal Strategic Corridor (incorporating the Hadrian's Wall Cycling and Walking Corridor project) and the A591 Strategic Corridor, LCWIP, Carlisle Social Enterprise City.

#### Priority 2 - Improving Health and Wellbeing

Health City Forum Priorities, ICC priorities, Cumbria Public Health Strategy, Cumbria Health & Wellbeing Board Strategy  
**NEW:** a specific focus on Tackling Inequalities, Mental and Social Wellbeing, Healthy Weight, Community Resilience (in its broadest sense) and Age Friendly Communities.

### Priority 3 - Improving outcomes for Children and Young People

Healthy Weight & tackling obesity, emotional health, young carers, NEET young people, Children & Young Peoples Working Group Action Plan.

**NEW:** Support work of Looked after Children Champion, Domestic Abuse, development of play and youth provision in urban & rural areas, support Carlisle Holiday Activities Partnership (CHAP) and HAF schemes.

### Priority 4 - Developing Thriving Communities

Asset based community development, needs of hard to reach and most marginalised communities, Local Committee funds effectively allocated to priorities and work with partners to create thriving city centre with high profile events such as City of Lights, support affordable food schemes and reduce food miles & waste, work with partner to promote greater independence in communities, support work of Armed Forces and Veterans Champion and Autism Champion,

**NEW:** with partners and Carlisle Resilience Group support community recovery & resilience from Covid19, Carlisle Communities network, support development of celebratory community events to mark Queens Platinum Jubilee and Hadrian's Wall 1900 Anniversary, external funding maximised for example COMF.

### Opportunities for 2022-23 Legacy Year

Carlisle Local Committee Funding is maximised and effectively allocated to priorities with existing grant panel and grants process. Proposed new funds:

- Holiday Provision Schemes £34,000 allocated from 0-19 (2<sup>nd</sup> yr.).
- Environment Fund schemes.
- COMF (Contain Outbreak Management Fund) grants.
- Celebratory Community Events Fund – to support development of small community events for Queens Platinum Jubilee and Hadrian's Wall 1900 Anniversary - £27,000 allocated (£1500 per electoral division).
- Support large scale local events from Area Wide Grants – such as City of Lights.
- Support Community Development team to deliver community engagement events with partners such as community & youth celebration/conference, community resilience winter events, electoral divisional events/forums.
