## **ROAD SAFETY UPDATE**

### **1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

**1.1** *The purpose of this Report is to raise awareness of the road safety management arrangements and activities that the Cumbria Road Safety Partnership currently has in place.*

### **4.0 BACKGROUND**

**4.1** The Cumbria Road Safety Partnership (the Partnership) has been in existence for more than a decade.

**4.2** The Partnership makes full use of information technology and has established a website which can be found at [www.crsp.co.uk](http://www.crsp.co.uk)

- 4.3 The home page of the CRSP website links to a *Useful Documents* page which contains the Annual Road Safety Plan 2019 to 2022 and other documents.
- 4.4 The Partnership operates mainly through its monthly tasking meeting referred to as CRASH (Casualty Reduction and Safer Highways).
- 4.5 The Agenda of the CRASH meetings and the CRSP Road Safety Plan 2019 to 2022 are attached to this report as appendices 1 and 2 respectively.
- 4.6 At the time of the production of this report the CRSP is considering new approaches which we hope will help to reduce road casualties. One of these is the possible adoption of Lancashire's *Safe Drive Stay Alive* initiative aimed at Young Drivers, which we recently piloted at the Rheged Centre. This initiative makes use of the experiences of those that have to deal with the aftermath of a road traffic collision e.g. a family liaison officer. It would compliment the road awareness training, (RAT) that we have provided for a number of years.
- 4.7 In addition to RAT, which we have recently reviewed and improved we also routinely provide those things which are detailed in the Road Safety Plan which includes efforts to promote these such as media releases and by the recommendations of local driving instructors.
- 4.8 The latest performance figures that we have available for the County are as below, which illustrates how this Local Committee compares with others.

The County Council must prepare and carry out a programme of measures designed to promote road safety, and may contribute towards the cost of measures for promoting road safety taken by other authorities or bodies.

The County Council must carry out studies into accidents arising out of the use of vehicles on roads within their area.

The County Council must in the light of those studies, take such measures as appear to the authority to be appropriate to prevent such accidents, including the dissemination of information and advice relating to the use of roads, the giving of practical training to road users or any class or description of road users, the construction, improvement, maintenance or repair of roads for the maintenance of which they are responsible and other measures taken in the exercise of their powers for controlling, protecting or assisting the movement of traffic on roads, and

The County Council, in constructing new roads, must take such measures as appear to the authority to be appropriate to reduce the possibilities of such accidents when the roads come into use.
